LITERACY

Daily Reading - Each morning read a book of your choice and add it to your Reading Log (to be used every day).

Phonemic Awareness - Learning Intention: To hear the final sound in a one syllable word.

Follow the instructions on the "phonemic awareness - final sounds" sheet to complete the activity.

Phonics - Learning Intention: To read and write words with the digraph "ck".

Children independently sound out and blend (read) the "ck" words on the sheet, then ask a family member to call out each word and write it in your writing journal.

Reading - Learning Intention: To predict and justify what a book might be about using the title and front cover. This week we will be completing our Literacy activities based on the book "Henny Penny" by H. Werner Zimmermann. Today's activity is a book prediction. Please see the attached sheet with the front cover of the book "Henny Penny" and a definition of the reading strategy: predicting. Please discuss what predicting is with your child before orally answering the two questions at the bottom.

Handwriting - Learning Intention: To form the upper and lower-case Aa correctly on dotted thirds. Watch the Aa handwriting video uploaded on Seesaw demonstrating how to correctly form your letters on the dotted thirds sheet attached.

Writing - Learning Intention: To sound out and write my words by myself.

Think back to your oral prediction for the story "Henny Penny" and ask your child to write their responses to the questions in their writing journal. Remind your child to sound out their words by themselves. (Parents: it is really important in Year 1 that your child attempts to sound out and write unknown words independently. We understand that all words will not be spelt correctly. If a word is unrecognisable, we would appreciate if you wrote their intended word above in pen to support us with marking.)
